暑假即將來臨,祝福每個康橋家庭都能有個平安健康且充實的假期。



In groups, the students needed to discuss some big milestones in Olympic Games history - When did the Olympic Games start? Who invented it? When could women start participating? Which traditional sports were inherited from the ancient Olympics and passed down through time until today? After that, students found all the answers in a short video about the history of the Olympic Games. After becoming more familiar with the origins of the Olympics, students competed in groups to test their knowledge of Olympic history.

Olympic Opening Ceremony

When it comes to the Olympics, one must give special mention to the spectacular opening ceremony. So what happens in an Olympic Games opening ceremony? At this station, students had the chance to experience one. They watched a short video of all the Olympic opening ceremonies from 1908 to 2016, took the oath, and learned the meaning of the Olympic rings symbol. They were surprised by how creatively the Olympic flame was lit, how fancy the performances were and how solemnly the athletes took their oaths. After learning about the opening ceremony, we were so happy to hear our students share what it means to be a good sport and always try your best.





Surfing at the Olympic Games

Many of the students are familiar with some sports at the Olympic Games, but probably not the latest one. Surfing was approved to be one of the five new sports at the 2020 Olympic Games. Nothing sounds better than surfing in the water on hot summer days. Therefore, our students participated in a surfing

competition. Each class was divided into 5 groups to represent 5 different countries. After the rules were announced, all the players tried their best to focus and keep their balance on a surfboard. The activity showed the students that sports require their physical strength as well as their concentration to do well. At the end, the winning group received the laurel, just like the champions got during the ancient Olympic Games.

Exploring the World through Tall Tales

An Inspiration for Tall Tales

We all know how important reading is for kids. It entertains and educates, helps with their memory and listening skills, and can aid them in understanding complex ideas. Philip Pullman once said, "After nourishment, shelter and companionship, stories are the thing we need most in this world." It is the fun, crazy and fantastic tall tale in particular that gets our imaginations flowing. Through the project, Ben's Journey in KCIS, this creative use of imagination was instilled in our students this year.

Tall Tales Take Students on Imaginative Adventures

In the reading, <u>Ben the Bullfrog</u>, Ben traveled through dry land, forest and prairie to find his perfect home - the Great Lakes. Students recognized the author's use of exaggeration by analyzing how Ben was described in each stage of the story. They discussed the differences between Ben and regular frogs, especially with respect to their physical growth, and this triggered our students' imaginations. Students then studied the descriptions of Ben more closely and became aware of how the author built up his superpowers from the real to the make-believe. This expanded our students' imaginations even further, and they developed an appreciation for the most interesting aspect of tall tales - exaggeration.





Following this, we made it authentic for our students by bringing Ben the Bullfrog into their own lives. Ben came to Kang Chiao! This further piqued our students' interest, and they brainstormed what animals Ben might meet on his journey around Kang Chiao's campus. Students discussed and wrote down all the animals they have seen or heard around the school. They worked collaboratively to decide which animal they would like to find out more about, and they made up a potential problem that the animal might face and Ben might help solve. This gave students a chance to reflect on and consider the natural environment. It was this fun and fantastic setting that made our students take complete ownership of the project.

With the problems their chosen animals would face decided on, we took our students on a little tour around the school, especially to the Nature Study Area. Students excitedly observed and recorded what they saw about the animals they had chosen in their natural surroundings. Having these visual cues helped them think about the problem in a new light which in turn helped them to create a better connection to the solution that Ben the Bullfrog might provide for that animal. Students then applied the writing techniques they had learned earlier to extend Ben's tall tale journey in KCIS.

After writing with exaggeration, they put themselves in the main characters' shoes and acted out their own tall tales. They created a dialogue for the characters and practiced sharing their own feelings through role-play. This was quite different from just reading a tall tale because they relied completely on their own imaginations, and it helped spark their enthusiasm and increase their confidence and creativity even more. This also opened a window of opportunity for them to share their unique tall tales in a special way for English Open Day.



Showing Appreciation and Enjoyment

This was a wonderfully authentic and engaging project for our students. They underwent personal growth through their participation in the various activities that enabled them to creatively express themselves, perform and learn to appreciate tall tales. It tapped into their natural abilities for make-believe by

turning them into young storytellers and encouraging them to be as crazy with their creativity as possible. We hope that you enjoyed their tall tales on English Open Day as much as we did!


Ben felt happy after this journey. Ben saw one tall building. He wanted to know more about that building. He decided to continue on his journey.




A MOMENT IN TIME


technology class is lots of fun because you can make a lot of things using a computer. Here is a comment from one of the Grade 6 students, "Art
